- AM Your flight will touch down at **Dublin International Airport**You must clear Irish Immigration and Customs procedures <u>please insure that all</u>
  instruments etc. are collected and cleared through customs
- AM Walk as a group to the coach parking area for **Terminal 2** load the equipment truck with the instruments. You will load your personal baggage on your motor coach.
- AM Group departs for a tour of **Glenalough** ~ is home to one of the most important monastic sites in Ireland. This early Christian monastic settlement was founded by St. Kevin in the 6th century and from this developed the "Monastic City". Most of the buildings that survive today date from the 10th through 12th centuries. Despite attacks by Vikings over the years, Glendalough thrived as one of Ireland's great ecclesiastical foundations and schools of learning until the Normans destroyed the monastery in 1214 A.D. and the dioceses of Glendalough and Dublin were united.
- AM Group stops on the M11 at junction 14 at the Applegreen students can get some coffee or something to eat if they wish rest room stop (individual cost)

- PM After your visit to **Glenalough** load the coach and continue your journey to **Waterford** traveling via the **Dunbrody Famine ship**The Dunbrody Famine Ship Experience features an authentic reproduction of a 1840s emigrant vessel, alongside a popular interpretation of the Irish famine emigrant experience
- PM Arrive in Waterford at your hotel: **Granville Hotel Waterford Meagher's Quay, Waterford, Ireland Tel:** +353-51-305-555

- PM Dinner this evening will be in the hotel

# SUNDAY, March 14, 2021

(Meals included- Dinner)

- AM Enjoy your first taste of a **full Irish Breakfast** this morning (eggs, rashers (bacon), sausage, black pudding, white pudding, beans and brown bread) and wash it all down with a cup of Irish Tea. ~ Of course you can have a breakfast of cereal, yogurt, toast and coffee if you wish.
- AM Load the coach and depart for **Cork traveling** via Youghal
- AM **Youghal** is one of the hidden gems of Ireland's Ancient East tracing its roots back to Viking times and was the home of Sir Walter Raleigh who lived in the town for 17 years; and was responsible for changing Irish history by introducing the potato and tobacco to Ireland.
- PM Arrive in **Cork** the second largest city in Ireland and home to one of the major universities in Ireland. Continue through the city to Blarney
- PM Visit **Blarney Castle Blarney Castle** was built nearly six hundred years ago by one of Ireland's greatest chieftains, Cormac MacCarthy, and has been attracting attention beyond Munster ever since. Over the last few hundred years, millions have flocked to Blarney, making it a world landmark and one of Ireland's greatest treasures.
- PM Enjoy time to explore and **kiss the Blarney Stone**
- PM Lunch (student cost) at the coffee shop at the Woolen Mills
- PM Return to Waterford via **St Cartages Cathedral in Lismore** standing since 1633 stop for a quick visit
- PM Mount Mercy University will have an advertised Joint Concert with the Waterford Barrack Street Band -https://www.barrackstreetband.com/
- PM Dinner and overnight in Waterford

## **MONDAY MARCH 15**

(Meals included: breakfast, dinner)

- AM Enjoy breakfast in the hotel
- AM Check out of the hotel and load the coach
- AM Tour en-route to Galway the Arts Capitol of Ireland
- AM Visit the **Rock of Cashel,** is one of Ireland's most spectacular archaeological rises from a grassy plain on the outskirts of the town and bristles with ancient fortifications the word 'cashel' is an anglicised version of the Irish word caiseal, meaning 'fortresses. Sturdy walls circle an enclosure that contains a complete round tower, a roofless abbey and the finest 12th-century Romanesque chapel in Ireland. For more than 1000 years the Rock of Cashel was a symbol of power, and the seat of kings and churchmen who ruled over the region.
- AM Continue your journey to **Bunratty Castle and Folk Park**, where you will be able to tour the park, which is a recreation of rural life in Ireland during the Victorian times.
- PM Enjoy lunch in the vicinity of Bunratty Folk Park either at the Tea House or just up the lane at Durty Nelly's
- PM Continue heading west heading to the wild Atlantic coast to visit the dramatic **Cliffs of Moher.**
- PM Enjoy your time at the Cliffs
- PM Load the coach and continue your journey up the west coast of Ireland passing through the village of Lisdoonvarna (famous for its Matchmaking Festival every August) before arriving in Galway

- PM Dinner in the hotel this evening

### **TUESDAY MARCH 16**

(Meals included: breakfast, dinner)

AM Enjoy breakfast in the hotel

AM Departure from the hotel for the **Marian Shrine at Knock**The <u>Story of Knock</u> began on the 21st August 1879 when Our Lady, St. Joseph and St. John the Evangelist appeared at the south gable of Knock Parish Church.

The apparition was <u>witnessed by fifteen people</u>, young and old. From this miraculous Apparition Knock has grown to the status of an internationally recognized Marian Shrine. The personal pilgrimage of Pope John Paul II in 1979, commemorating the centenary of the apparition, inspired an even greater devotion to the Shrine and endorsed the indelible seal of Vatican approval. Mother Teresa of Calcutta visited the Shrine in June of 1993. One and a half million <u>pilgrims</u> visit the <u>Shrine</u> annually.

- AM Mount Mercy University Choir will perform at Knock during the Mass service if that is unavailable we will have the choir sing at the evening Mass at the Cathedral in Galway
  - PM Free time for lunch in the area (student cost)
  - PM Visit **BalliIntubber Abbey** (guided tour)

Ballintubber Abbey is known as "the Abbey that refused to die". Through its many vicissitudes, including burning by Cromwell's army in 1653, the Abbey has remained a place of worship despite years of continuous attacks and religious repression.

Built in 1216 for the Canon Regulars of St Augustine, it is beside a 5th century monastic site associated with St Patrick. Ballintubber retains an air of ancient beauty and spirituality and has been restored with simple elegance. Pilgrims set out from the Abbey on the ancient pilgrim route, Tochar Phadraig, and journey some 22 miles to Croagh Patrick. It is the Church of choice for many people getting married one of the last 'notable' persons would have been the actor Pierce Brosnan.

After the visit and tour to the Abbey you will return to Galway **via a tour of Cong** (the location of the John Wayne / Maureen O'Hara movie "The Quiet Man" and home to Ashford Castle.

Arrive in Dublin & enjoy watching the St. Patrick's Day Parade

There can be no doubt Dublin is ground zero for St. Patrick's Day even though the actual Festival is a continuation of an American tradition, not an Irish one per se.

While the country has always celebrated St. Patrick's Day it was a religious holiday akin to our Easter. But numerous Irish immigrated to America when hard times befell the country in between WWI and WWII. They brought their tradition and their land with them, and St. Patrick's Day soon became big events in Boston, San Francisco and other cities with large Irish populations. These celebrations became so popular that they were actually carried back to Ireland, where the island took the idea and ran with it big time. The parade in Dublin is possibly the most colorful and vibrant St. Patrick's Day parade in the world, attracting thousands of revelers each year.

**Cathedral** which you will tour. Visit St. Mary's Pro Cathedral – seat of the Catholic Church in Dublin

Afterwards you will enter the Guinness Storehouse for the **full tour** and do not forget to get to the end "The Gravity Bar" where you will receive a pint of the freshest Guinness you will ever have ~ enjoy the view of Dublin city and the surrounding areas from your perch upon high.
