FRESHMEN

-) Cumulative GPA at least 2.75
- D Composite ACT at least 20 (SAT 1030)
-)) Class rank in the top half of graduating class
- Madmissions Committee reviews applications from students who do not meet minimum admission standards

TRANSFER

-) Cumulative transfer GPA at least 2.5
- 3) Students wishing to transfer with two semesters or less at their current school are reviewed by the Admissions Committee

In accordance with articulation agreements with all lowa community colleges, A.A. or A.S. degree holders with at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA will be automatically accepted for admission. Students graduating with an A.A.S. in Business Administration from Kirkwood with a minimum 2.0 GPA are also automatically accepted for admission.
