Plan for Elementary Education Transfer Major
Associate of Arts (AA) to Bachelor of Arts (BA)

1. **Complete your Associate of Arts Degree:** Students who transfer to Mount Mercy with an AA degree from an Eastern Iowa Community College will have all Core Curriculum requirements waived except the Mercy Capstone and one course in the Ultimate Questions domain. These two requirements must be taken at Mount Mercy.

Credits Transferred

- MMU will transfer up to 63 credits. Students will enter Mount Mercy as junior status.
- MMU requires 123 credits to graduate. Students transferring directly from Eastern Iowa CC will take remaining 60 credits at MMU to complete the major.

- A C- or higher is required in all major courses.
- Students with graduating with an AA and a minimum 2.0 GPA are automatically accepted for admission into MMU. Please follow application procedure at mtmercy.edu/apply.
