Transfer Plan for Criminal Justice
Associate of Arts (AA) to Bachelor of Arts (BA)

1. **Complete your Associate of Arts Degree:** Students who transfer to Mount Mercy with an AA degree from Kirkwood Community College will have all Core Curriculum requirements waived except the Mercy Capstone and one course in the Ultimate Questions domain. These two requirements must be taken at Mount Mercy.

Credits Transferred

- MMU will transfer up to 63 credits. Students will enter Mount Mercy in junior status.
