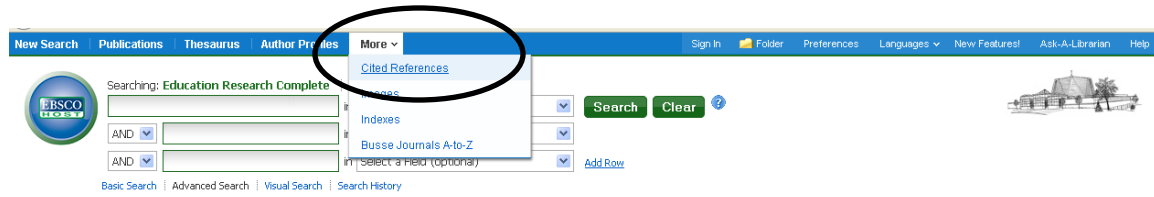


How do I track an author's citations through an EBSCO database?

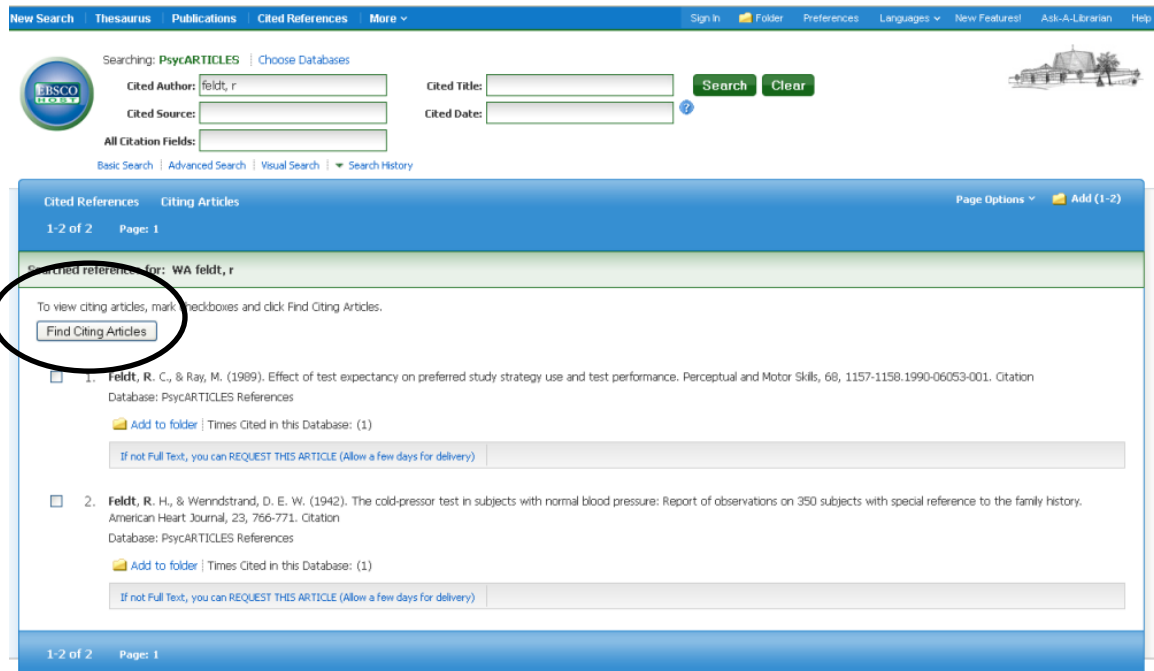
****If you wish to determine how often (and in what manner) an author or study has been CITED (referenced by others)****

Step One: Select “More” and then the “Cited References” option from the blue masthead of Education Research Complete.



Step Two: Insert portions of the study's citation into search fields. For authors with common last surnames, include a first initial. Other fields offer searching by journal title, article title, and publication year.

Step Three: Search results reflect indexed citations. Locate your study of interest from the roster of results. Check the box preceding the record. Now select “Find Citing Articles.”



Your author's citation (the original study) is included in THIS article's (the **checked** article) references list.
