

How do I locate film reviews and film criticism in EBSCO?

Step One: Select EBSCOhost from the Busse Library database roster. Now select the “Search all available EBSCO databases at once” option.

Step Two: Place the film’s name in quotation marks (as an exact phrase) and pair the title with the word “film” in the next search field. Limit documents further, if needed.

Step Three: Consider pairing a concept, character, or other aspect of the film as search terms. You can also use the phrase “film criticism,” “film study,” or “film adaptation.”

Step Four: If looking for a film review, use the film’s title in quotation marks and pair the title with the word “review.” Look for the “review” icon to note these items. You may also select “reviews” from the “Source Types” roster (left column) to see these results.
