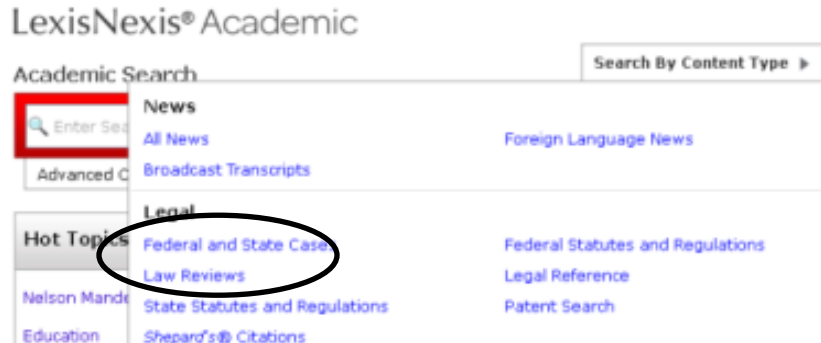
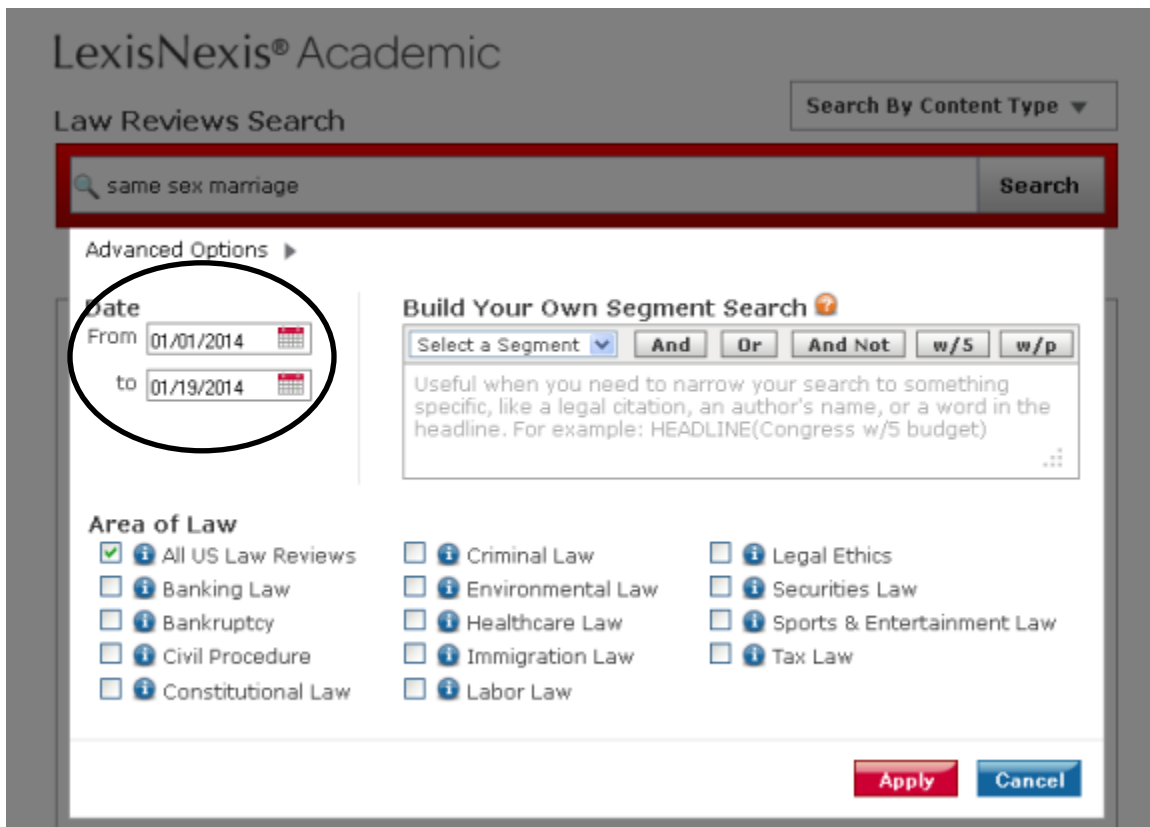


## How do I find an article from a law review?

**Step One:** Visit the Lexis-Nexis Academic homepage. From the “Search by Content Type” menu, select “Legal” and then select “Law Reviews.”



**Step Two:** At the next screen, links to landmark cases will be available. Enter a keyword subject into the red search box. Now select “Advanced Options.” Select date range and an applicable law specialty, if such applies. Now select “Apply” and then “Search” in the red search box.



**Step Three:** Now select a title from the search results to view the corresponding article. Browse results from the “Sources by Category” left menu to see individual publications

found in the roster. Select an individual publication to see associated articles. Each article provides printing, saving, email, and citing functions through its tool bar, seen on the right.
